WCC hosts fourth *Why We Write* panel: An immersive conversation in Ottawa

On Tuesday, June 10, 2025, Writers Collective of Canada hosted *Why We Write: Ottawa*, the fourth in a multi-city panel event series. Guest panelists included **Mark Frutkin**, award-winning author; **Billie Nell**, award-winning theatre creator and spoken word artist; and WCC writers and facilitators **Sharon Roberts** and **Steven Belanger**.

Why We Write is a compelling, timely and necessary discussion around the social impact of making art amidst an epidemic of isolation and loneliness.

WCC publishes *Then, I was a dragon* – writing by women who have served in the Canadian military

This landmark collection of writing from Canadian women veterans is the product of a unique community writing and mentorship program called Her Story, developed by Writers Collective of Canada (WCC) and delivered over nine weeks.

The diversity of these stories and poems is a testament to how the WCC workshop experience creates a wide-open space for self-discovery and expression. These narrators wrestle with trauma, celebrate freedom, and explore life's many seasons through story. Just as powerfully, this collection provides confirmation of the authors' journeys from isolation to community.

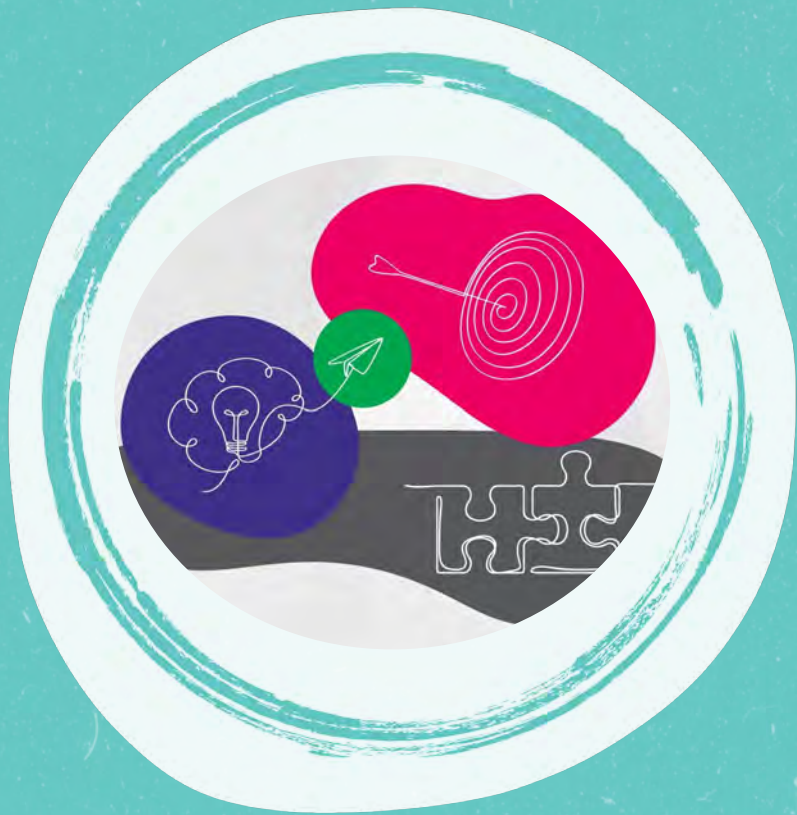


Dr. Nancy Taber awarded SSHRC funding for research project in collaboration with WCC

Employing WCC's creative writing methodology, the study will trace the transformative power of community writing workshops and illuminate the under-represented, gendered experiences of women within military culture.

WCC launches workplace programs to elevate team connection, listening, and feedback

Writers Collective of Canada (WCC) is sharing its expertise in facilitation, deep listening, strength-based feedback, and igniting connection through creativity with workplace teams.

In 2025, WCC reached more than 550 public service employees in Ontario through an International Women's Day workshop.

We also launched *On The Same Page*, a creative workshop for corporate partners that helps teams show up fully, navigate change with confidence, and build cultures rooted in empathy, creativity, and trust.

Volunteer facilitators – the heart of our organization – take us with them to **new communities**

In 2025, WCC facilitators **proactively introduced WCC workshops in **China, Ukraine, the United States,** and many communities throughout Canada**

On World Mental Health Day 2025, a WCC facilitator hosted a writing workshop with staff at the Canadian embassy there. She told us:

“The timing of the workshop coincided with one of the biggest attacks on energy infrastructure and nobody slept the night before. Many woke up to electricity and water outages and many were not able to make it to work at all. I still went ahead with the workshop and I am so grateful I did. We connected more deeply as colleagues, we cried together and laughed, we appreciated each other even more.”
